Outcomes for disadvantaged pupils

Despite efforts since the Covid pandemic to re-close the attainment gap between Pupil Premium children and peers, the gaps remain stubborn.

Analysis of attendance data indicate that Pupil premium children's persistent absence and frequent late arrivals are impacting their attainment in lessons.

Pupil voice indicates that some children are reluctant to attend school, therefore we plan to shift focus onto supporting the social and emotional aspects of school in order to improve attendance and therefore attainment.
